Dumping, spills and releases of hazardous substances (including oil and petroleum products, chemicals, hazardous waste, pesticides), fish kills, and illegal open burning of items like tires, plastic, copper wire, asbestos covered materials (Not yard debris, see below)

Algae Blooms

Appearance of excessive algae (mats, surface scum) that may give off an unpleasant odor; can be associated with the death of other organisms like fish

Illegal Dumping

Any type of waste not disposed of at a permitted facility or landfill including appliances, tires, trash and medical waste. Pouring of the following items down or near stormdrains should also be reported: paint, household chemicals, pet waste, trash or grease
